### **Port Nippers**

What another great year we had in 2005/2006.

85 Nippers were enrolled in the program, with an average of 50 at each Sunday morning session and on average of 20 every Monday night.

Our Nippers did what they know how to do best and that is participate in the beach, board and water activities. We slip, slop, slapped and got in and had a go.

The Club provided a Water Safety Program for 120 Grade 5/6 Wembley Primary School Children as an alternative for their swimming program. Instead of doing laps in the pool, the children participate in beach activities, got to ride nipper boards, swam in the sea and was shown basic Life Saving techniques.

Overall, the children had a ball and had so much fun; the teachers were impressed with the dedication of the club and its members who assist with the program and the parents were happy that their children had the opportunity to experience something new. As a result of the program, Wembley Primary School has advised that this program will become the Grade 5/6's new swimming program.
